

🐱 Crochet Cat Remote Caddy – Complete Step-by-Step Tutorial

Create a fun and functional Halloween-themed crochet organizer with this **Cat Remote Caddy Pattern**! This project combines amigurumi techniques with practical storage, resulting in a striped cat-shaped holder perfect for remotes, phones, or small items.



This is an **intermediate-level project**, but with this detailed guide, even confident beginners can follow along successfully.



Difficulty: Intermediate | **Time:** ~4-6 Hours | **Yardage:** 1 Ball (each) Black, Orange | **Other:** Small amount pink yarn, 2x 12mm cat eyes, toy stuffing

KEY METHODS & STITCHES LEGEND

- CH** Chain Stitch
Pull a new loop through.
- SC** Single Crochet
Insert, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through both loops.
- HDC** Half Double Crochet
Yarn over, insert, pull up a loop, yarn over, pull through all three loops.
- DC** Double Crochet
Yarn over, insert, pull up a loop, (yarn over, pull through two loops) x2.
- MR** Magic Ring
Form an adjustable ring to begin rounds.
- INC** Increase
Work 2 sc in the same stitch.
- DEC** Invisible Decrease
Pick up the front loops of the next 2 stitches, yarn over, pull through 2 loops, yarn over, pull through both loops.
- SL ST** Slip Stitch
Insert, yarn over, pull through both loops.
- FLO / BLO** Front Loop Only / Back Loop Only
- STRIPING** Change colors on the last pull-through of the prior attach.

I. THE MAIN BODY (Striped Block) & POCKETS

Start with a chain for base width.

FLO/BLO placement.

Row 1 (Black): SC across.
Rows 2-3 (Orange): SC in BLO across.
(Repeat color change 3 rows of orange/1 row black)

Crochet separate strips and sewing them them on or integrating them.

II. THE CAT HEAD (Amigurumi Style)

Rnd 1	4 sc	(6)	Rnd 7	8 sc	(0)
Rnd 2	8 sc	(1)	Rnd 9	10 sc	(2)
Rnd 3	12 sc	(2)	Rnd 19	14 sc	(3)
Rnd 4	16 sc	(3)	Rnd 13	15 sc	(4)
Rnd 5	24 sc	(4)	Rnd 27	23 sc	(3)
Rnd 6	25 sc	(5)	Rnd 27	35 sc	(3)

5. Insert safety eyes between Rnd 7 & 8, 8 sts apart.

6. Stuff head and complete decreases.

III. THE EARS (x2) & TAIL

Ear Pattern:
 Rnd 1: MR 4sc.
 Rnd 2: (SC, inc) x2 (6)
 Rnd 3: MR 4sc.
 Rnd 4: (SC, inc) x2 (6)
 Rnd 5: MR 4sc.
 Rnd 6: (SC, inc) x2 (6)
 Rnd 7: (SC, inc) x2 (6)
 Rnd 8: MR 4sc.
 Rnd 2-3B: SC around (maintained)
 Rnd 9: MR 4sc.
 Rnd 11: (SC, inc) x2 (6)
 Rnd 12: (SC, inc) x2 (4)
 Rnd 13: MR 4sc.
 Rnd 2-30: (8C, inc) x2 (6)

Tail Pattern:
 Rnd 1: MR 6sc.
 Rnd 2-30: MK 6sc.
 Rnd 2-30: SC around (maintain stitch count), stuffing lightly as you go. Pick up the front front loops of the next 2 stitches.
 Rnd 2-30: SC around (maintain stitch run), stuffing lightly as you go.

IV. FACIAL FEATURES & MUZZLE

Embroider the pink nose using satin stitch

Add and secure to row the stiff wire whiskers.

V. FINAL ASSEMBLY & PLACEMENT

- Sew head to main body top.
- Sew tail to main body rear.
- Securely stitch ears to head top.
- Integrate pockets during main body construction or sew on as separate panels.



Materials & Tools

- Worsted weight yarn:
 - Black (main color)
 - Orange (contrast color)
 - Small amount of pink (nose)
- Crochet hook (recommended: 4.0 mm / G-6)
- Stitch markers
- Yarn needle
- Scissors
- Fiberfill stuffing
- 2 safety eyes (12 mm recommended)
- Optional: thin wire (for whiskers)



Stitch Abbreviations (US Terms)

- CH – Chain
- SC – Single Crochet
- HDC – Half Double Crochet
- DC – Double Crochet
- MR – Magic Ring
- INC – Increase (2 SC in same stitch)
- DEC – Invisible Decrease
- SL ST – Slip Stitch
- FLO – Front Loop Only
- BLO – Back Loop Only



The Main Body (Striped Block) & Pockets

Step 1: Base Foundation

Start by chaining enough stitches to reach your desired base width (typically 25–35 chains depending on size).

Row 1 (Black):

Work **SC across** the entire row.

Step 2: Build the Striped Pattern

Rows 2–3 (Orange):
SC in BLO across.

Repeat the stripe pattern:

- 3 rows of orange
- 1 row of black

Continue this repetition until the piece reaches the desired height (approximately 20–25 rows total).

Step 3: Forming the Box Shape

- Fold the rectangle into a box shape.
- Seam the sides using slip stitch or whip stitch.
- Create a flat bottom by sewing the base corners inward.

Step 4: Adding Structure

- Optionally insert a piece of plastic canvas or cardboard at the base.
- This helps the caddy stand upright.

Step 5: Crochet the Pockets

Make 3–4 rectangular pocket panels:

- Chain 10–15 stitches
- Work SC rows in the same stripe pattern
- Crochet until pocket height is about half the body

Attach pockets evenly around the front and sides:

- Sew securely along the sides and bottom
- Leave the top open

The Cat Head (Amigurumi Style)

Work in continuous rounds using a stitch marker.

Step 1: Create the Head

Rnd 1: MR, 6 SC

Rnd 2: INC around (12)

Rnd 3: (SC, INC) ×6 (18)

Rnd 4: (2 SC, INC) ×6 (24)

Rnd 5: (3 SC, INC) ×6 (30)

Rnd 6: (4 SC, INC) ×6 (36)

Continue increasing until the head reaches a round, full shape.

Step 2: Insert Eyes

- Place safety eyes between **Rounds 7 and 8**
- Space them about **8 stitches apart**

Step 3: Shape the Head

Continue:

Rnd 7–12: SC around

Rnd 13+: Begin decreasing gradually using DEC

- Stuff the head firmly before closing
- Finish with a tight closure

The Ears (Make 2) & Tail

Ears (Triangle Shape)

Rnd 1: MR, 4 SC

Rnd 2: (SC, INC) ×2 (6)

Rnd 3: SC around

Rnd 4: (SC, INC) ×3 (9)

Rnd 5: SC around

- Fasten off, leave long tail for sewing
- Make inner ear detail in orange (optional) and stitch inside

Tail

Rnd 1: MR, 6 SC

Rnd 2–30: SC around (maintain tube shape)

- Stuff lightly as you go
- For a curved tail, insert flexible wire before closing

Facial Features & Muzzle

Nose

- Use pink yarn
- Embroider a small triangle using satin stitch

Whiskers

- Use white yarn or thin wire
- Insert or sew 3 whiskers on each side

Eyes

- Safety eyes give a bold look
- You can embroider pupils for extra detail

Final Assembly & Placement

Step 1: Attach the Head

- Sew the head securely to the top center of the box

Step 2: Attach the Tail

- Sew the tail to the back of the body
- Position slightly upward for a playful look

Step 3: Attach the Ears

- Sew ears to the top of the head
- Angle slightly outward

Step 4: Final Touches

- Adjust stuffing if needed
- Secure all loose ends
- Ensure pockets are firmly attached



Tips for Best Results

- Keep tension consistent for even stripes
- Use stitch markers to track rounds
- Stuff firmly, but not overly tight
- Block lightly if needed for shape



Finished Result
