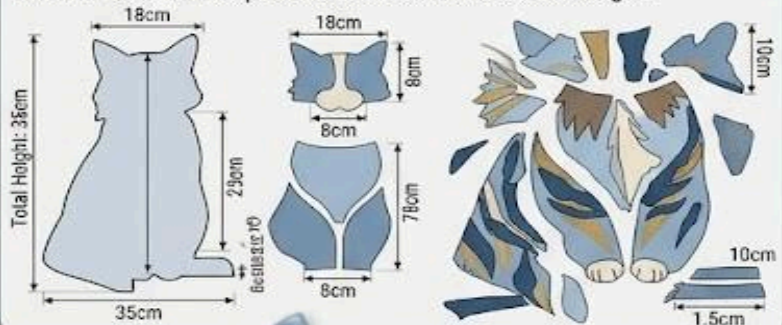
1 MATERIALS & PREPARATION

Gather all materials. Preshrink fabrics. Apply fusible web.

-  Denim wash
-  Medium wash

-  Gold metallic thread
-  Cream/White wool blend for the muzzle
-  Fusible Web
-  Sharp scissors
-  Hand-embroidery needles

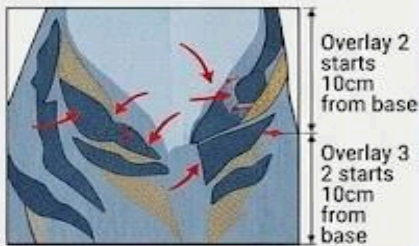
2 DESIGN & CUTTING

Trace pattern onto fusible web. Cut individual pattern pieces from chosen fabrics with specific seam allowance for raw edges.



3 LAYERING & FUSING

Carefully align layered pieces. Use precise heat and steam for fusing.



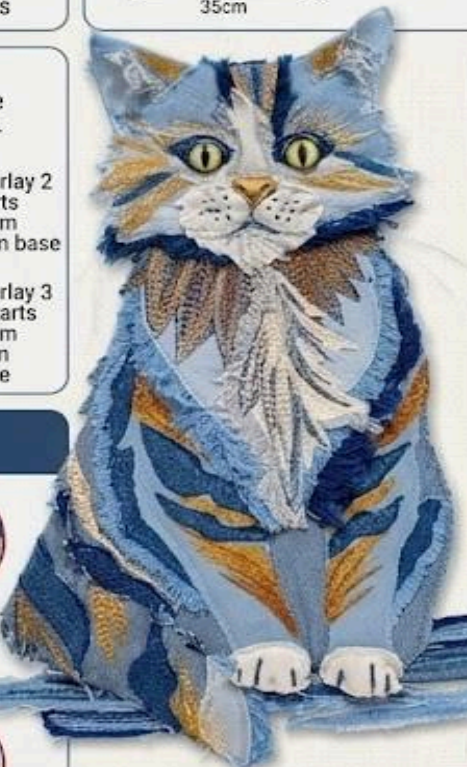

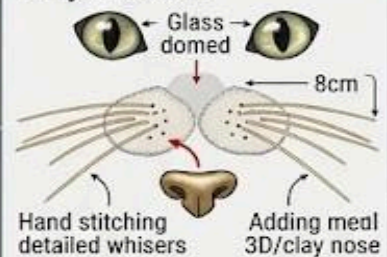
eg. Zig-zag or straight stitch

KEY AMERICAN QUILTING & SEWING METHODS USED

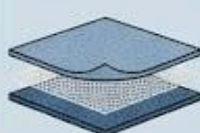
RAW-EDGE APPLIQUE



RAW-EDGE APPLIQUE

Overlaying pieces with edges left unfattened for texture.

FUSIBLE WEB

Iron-on adhesive to hold complex applique pieces.

FREE-MOTION QUILTING

Guiding the fabric freely for organic thread designs.

Materials & Preparation

Before beginning, gather all your materials and prepare your fabrics properly. This step is essential for achieving clean, long-lasting results.

You will need:

- Denim fabrics in different washes:
 - Light (denim wash)
 - Medium wash
 - Dark wash
- Gold metallic thread ✨
- Cream or white wool blend (for the muzzle area)
- Fusible web (iron-on adhesive)
- Sharp fabric scissors
- Hand-embroidery needles
- Sewing machine (optional but recommended)

Preparation steps:

1. **Pre-wash all fabrics** to prevent shrinking later.
2. **Dry and iron** fabrics to remove wrinkles.
3. Organize denim tones from light to dark—this helps when layering for shading effects.

Design & Cutting

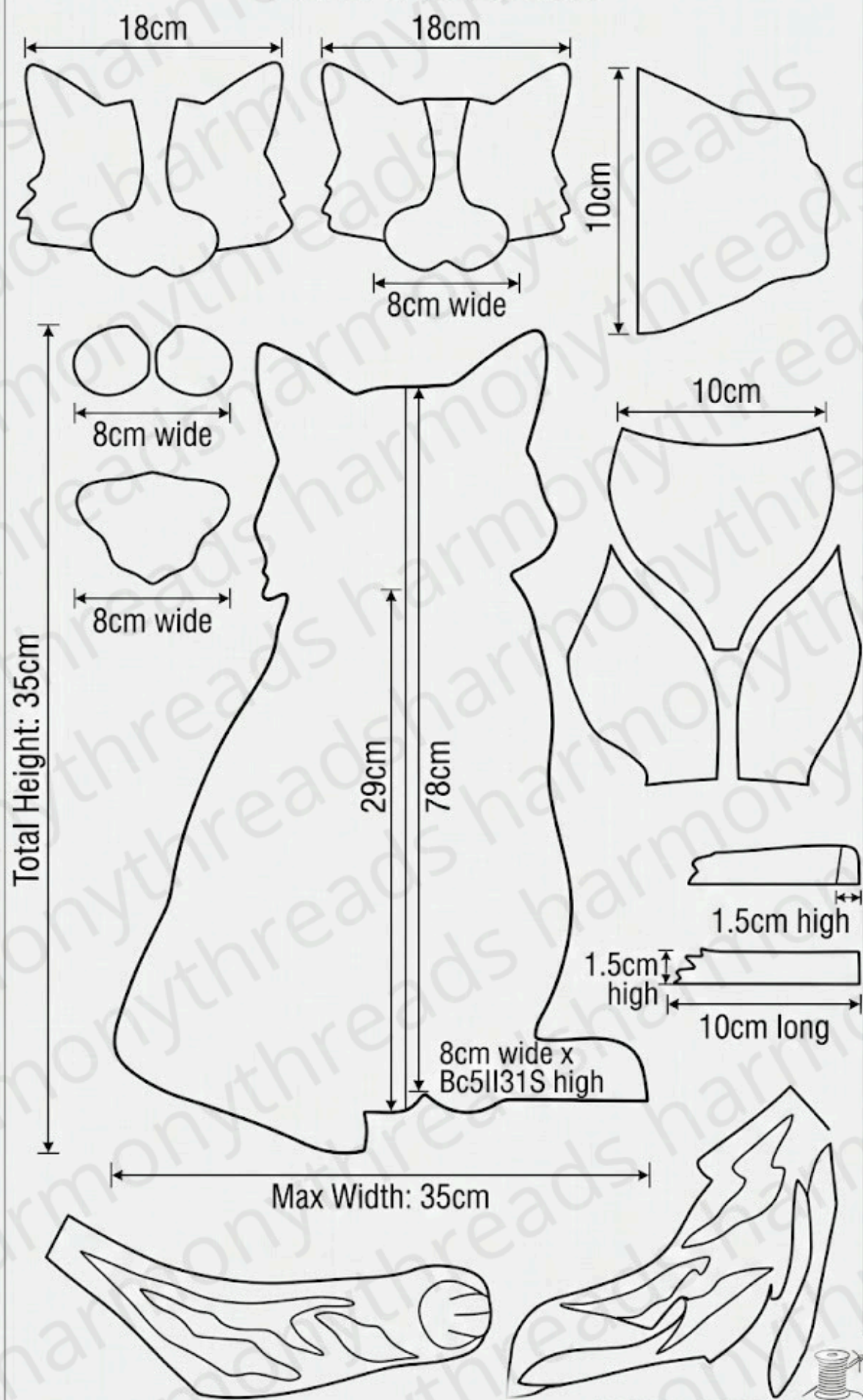
This is where your cat begins to take shape!

1. Trace the full cat pattern onto fusible web.
2. Cut out each section separately.
3. Fuse the pattern pieces onto the back of your chosen fabrics.

Follow approximate dimensions from the diagram:

- Total height: ~35 cm
- Body width: ~18 cm
- Head width: ~18 cm
- Individual pieces (ears, legs, tail) vary from 8 cm to 10 cm

PRINT AT 100% SCALE



Important tips:

- Leave a small seam allowance for raw-edge effects.
- Use different denim shades strategically to create depth (lighter for highlights, darker for shadows).
- Cut gold fabric strips or plan stitching areas for decorative accents.

Layering & Fusing

Now it's time to assemble your cat!

1. Start with a **base fabric** (this will be your background).
2. Position the largest body piece first.
3. Gradually layer smaller pieces on top.

Layering guide:

- Begin with the torso
- Add legs and tail
- Position head and ears
- Finish with facial details

Important:

- Align pieces carefully before fusing.
- Use an iron with **heat and steam** to secure each layer.
- Suggested placement:
 - Second layer begins about 10 cm from base
 - Third layer overlaps similarly for a natural look

This layering technique creates a dimensional, artistic effect 🎨

Quilting & Fraying Techniques

This step brings texture and personality to your artwork!

A. Machine Raw-Edge Appliqué

- Stitch along the edges of each piece using a sewing machine.
- Use a straight stitch or zig-zag stitch.
- Do NOT tuck edges under—leave them raw for fraying.


B. Free-Motion Quilting (FMQ)

- Use gold thread to stitch decorative lines across the body.
- Move fabric freely under the needle to create organic shapes.
- Try:
 - Zig-zag patterns
 - Flowing lines following the cat's fur direction

C. Encouraging Fraying

This is the signature effect of this piece!

- Gently brush or rub the edges of denim pieces.
- Use a seam ripper or your fingers to loosen threads.
- Focus on:
 - Tail edges
 - Chest fur
 - Body contours

The more controlled fraying you add, the more artistic and textured your cat will look 

Final Details & Mounting

Now we bring your cat to life!

A. Eyes & Nose

- Use **glass domed eyes** or fabric appliqué.
- Approximate spacing: 8 cm apart.
- Add:
 - Hand-stitched whiskers
 - A small 3D nose (can be clay or fabric-stuffed)

Tips:

- Use light thread for whiskers.
- Stitch carefully to keep symmetry.

B. Paws & Tail Fraying

- Add hand-stitched details to paws.
- Cut tail fabric into strips:
 - About 1.5 cm wide
 - Around 10 cm long
- Fray edges for a fluffy effect

Quilting & Sewing Techniques Used

Here's a quick overview of the techniques you've applied:

- **Raw-edge appliqué:** layering fabric without folding edges
- **Fusible web bonding:** securing pieces before stitching
- **Free-motion quilting:** adding artistic stitching patterns
- **Textural quilting:** building depth and dimension
- **Hand embroidery:** fine details like whiskers and facial features

Final Result

Once everything is stitched and detailed:

1. Trim excess background fabric.
2. Mount your piece onto a backing board or frame.
3. Press lightly if needed (avoid flattening frayed areas).
