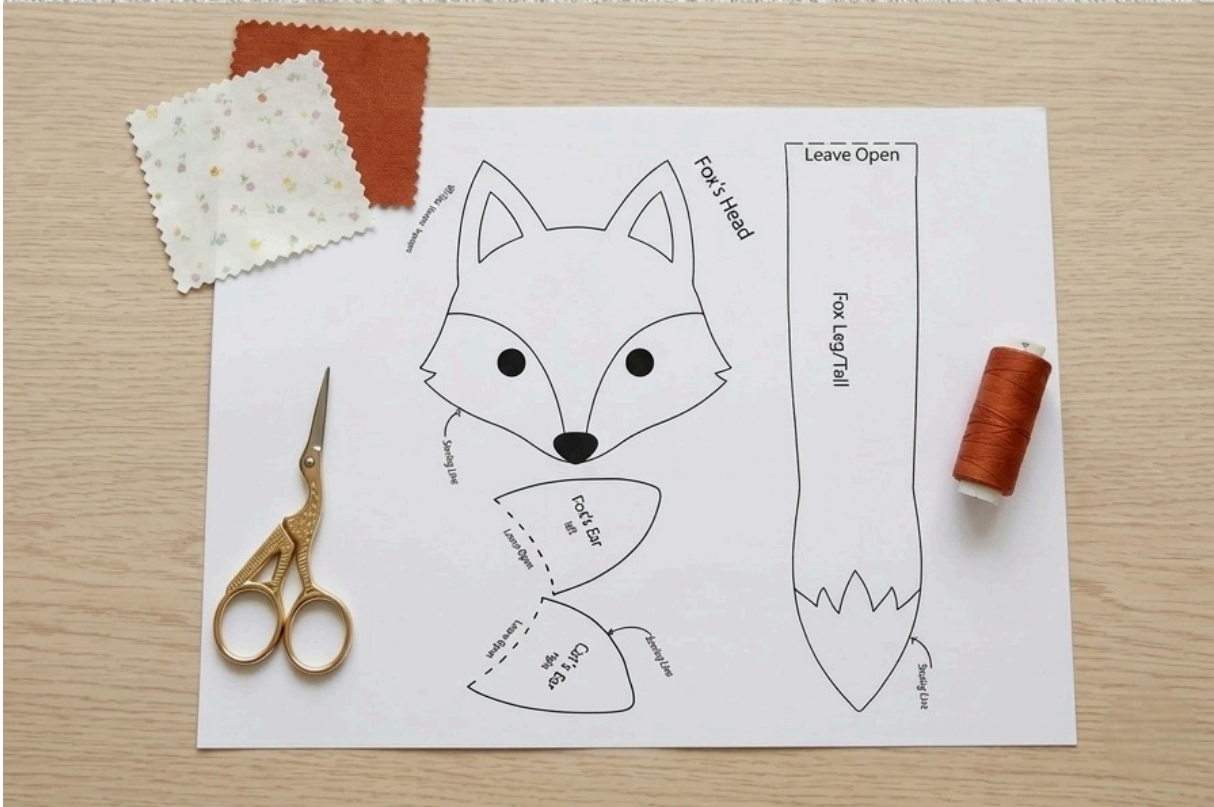


## Fox Cushion Pattern Tutorial

This **Fox Cushion Pattern** is a sweet sewing project that combines a soft rectangular pillow with a cute fox face, ears, legs, and tail. It is perfect for nursery décor, kids' rooms, handmade gifts, or cozy woodland-themed decoration.



## Materials You Will Need

To make this fox cushion, prepare soft cotton or linen fabric for the pillow base, rust-orange fabric for the fox parts, white or cream fabric for the muzzle and tail tip, black felt or safety eyes for the eyes and nose, matching thread, stuffing, scissors, pins, sewing machine, hand sewing needle, and printed pattern templates.



Use a soft floral fabric for the cushion body if you want the same delicate look shown in the picture. For the fox, choose a warm orange or terracotta fabric. The contrast between the light cushion and the orange fox pieces helps the design stand out beautifully.

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You will also need paper templates for the fox head, inner ears, fox legs, fox tail, muzzle, and tail tip. Make sure your pattern pieces are printed at the size you want before cutting fabric.

## Cutting the Pattern Pieces

Start by cutting two large rectangles for the pillow body. These will become the front and back of the cushion. You can adjust the size, but a good finished size is around 12 x 18 inches.

Cut the fox head from orange fabric. Cut two ears as part of the head shape, or separately if your pattern uses separate ear pieces. Cut two inner ear pieces from white or cream fabric.

Cut the muzzle pieces from white or cream fabric. These pieces should fit along the lower part of the fox face, creating the classic pointed fox look.

Cut two front legs from orange fabric. Each leg should be cut twice, right sides together, so you can sew and stuff them.

Cut the long fox tail from orange fabric. Cut the tail tip from white or cream fabric. The pattern shows a pointed tail with a zigzag white section at the end, so cut carefully to keep the shape neat.

## Sewing the Fox Face

Place the white muzzle pieces on the orange fox head. Pin them in place and sew close to the edge using a straight stitch or small zigzag stitch.

Add the inner ear pieces inside the orange ears. Stitch them down neatly. This gives the fox face more detail and makes it look finished.

Attach the eyes using black safety eyes, buttons, or black felt circles. If the cushion is for a baby or very young child, embroidered eyes are the safest option.

For the nose, use black felt or fabric. Place it at the bottom center of the face, where the muzzle pieces meet. Sew it securely by hand or machine.

You can also add small stitched details around the muzzle using matching or slightly darker thread. Keep the stitches smooth and simple so the fox keeps a soft handmade look.

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## Sewing the Legs and Tail

Place each leg piece right sides together. Sew around the edges, leaving the top open for turning and stuffing.

Turn the legs right side out. Add a small amount of stuffing so they look soft but not too bulky. The legs should hang gently from the bottom of the cushion.

For the tail, sew the white tail tip onto the orange tail piece first. Then place the tail pieces right sides together and sew around the edges, leaving the base open.

Turn the tail right side out and stuff lightly. The tail should have shape, but it should still be soft enough to bend slightly.

Set the legs and tail aside while you prepare the cushion body.

## Assembling the Cushion

Place the fox face on the front cushion fabric. Position it near the center, slightly lower than the top edge, just like in the photo. Pin it in place and sew around the fox head carefully.

Now place the legs along the bottom edge of the front cushion piece. The raw edges should point outward, and the stuffed parts should face inside the cushion while sewing.

Place the tail along one side of the cushion. The raw edge of the tail should line up with the side seam. Make sure the tail is facing inward before sewing the cushion together.

Place the back cushion rectangle on top of the front piece, right sides together. Pin all around the edges.

Sew around the cushion, leaving an opening for turning. Be careful when sewing over the legs and tail so they stay secure.

Turn the cushion right side out through the opening. Gently push out the corners. Stuff the cushion evenly until it is soft and full.

Close the opening using a ladder stitch by hand.

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## Finishing Touches

Check the fox face, legs, and tail to make sure everything is securely attached. Fluff the cushion and shape the stuffing with your hands.

You can add extra personality with embroidered cheeks, small whisker stitches, or decorative topstitching around the fox face.

For a cleaner look, press the fabric before sewing each piece. This helps the cushion look professional and neat.

Your **Fox Cushion Pattern** is now complete — a charming handmade pillow with a woodland fox design, perfect for decorating or gifting.

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
